At 5:00 pm we begin our banquet dinner and it will be served until 6:15 pm. The Live Auction begins at 6:30 pm.

The cost of the banquet dinner remains at \$18 per person, which includes the gratuity. The banquet is served buffet-style and on the menu this year: Chicken Parmesan and Pork Loin with Apple Chutney with all the trimmings including a garden fresh salad, pasta salad, dinner rolls, green beans, carrots and potatoes.
